Welcome to the 85th Annual Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland banquet, and Happy Birthday to the Old-Timers for their 85 years of baseball enthusiasm. Through your love of the American pastime, we have gathered this 31 days before catchers and pitchers report to spring training to again talk baseball with our friends, teammates and umpires. We thank the Harry Demorest Foundation, Davidson Benefits Planning and Olsson Industrial Electric for supporting this year's banquet.

At this time, we remember several outstanding members of the local baseball scene who passed away in 2018: Len Neal, who caught for the Portland Beavers during his 16-year professional career; Bill Moore, who played for Beaverton High and Willamette University before playing professionally; Bob Olson, who played at Wilson High and professionally, then coached at Portland State University, the University of Portland and Jackson High; and Joe Gatto, whose Cleveland High career earned him a place in the Portland Interscholastic League Hall of Fame, and who later played semipro ball.

It was another outstanding year for baseball in Oregon in 2018. Oregon State University battled its way through the College World Series to win the NCAA Division I national championship. In-state players for the Beavers included outfielder Jack Anderson (Lake Oswego High), infielder Andy Armstrong (West Salem High), outfielder Joe Casey (Crescent Valley High), pitcher Brandon Eisert (Aloha High), pitcher Dylan Pearce (Crater High), catcher/infielder Adley Rutschman (Sherwood High), catcher/infielder Zak Taylor (Sherwood High), pitcher Sam Tweedt (South Salem High), pitcher Mitchell Verburg (Lake Oswego High), outfielder Elliot Willy (Bend High) and catcher/infielder Zack Zalesky (Corvallis High). We honor Pat Casey, a Newberg High and University of Portland product who stepped down as head coach after the season; moving into the head coaching role is longtime OSU assistant Pat Bailey, who guided George Fox University to an NCAA Division III national title in 2004. Also, the Corvallis Knights won their third straight West Coast League title.

In the midst of tonight's fellowship and good feeling toward the game of baseball, also keep in mind the mission of the Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland:

To enhance the reputation of the organization and its philosophy to serve both amateur and professional baseball in Portland, Oregon and the surrounding community; this organization will undertake the following:

1. Host the annual Awards Banquet, which will provide scholarship opportunities to deserving high school senior student-athletes based on academics, involvement in public service efforts, and athletic skill. The banquet will also serve as the annual formal opportunity to bring together all baseball enthusiasts, coaches, past and current amateur and professional athletes and, equally important, the many volunteers in the community.

2. Provide coaching and clinical forums to youth in various communities.

3. Sponsor an annual golf tournament, the proceeds of which will go toward community baseball youth programs and scholarship opportunities based on the above criteria.

4. Take an active position in the role of baseball in both the community-related and school-related programs.

Over the past 84 years, the Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland has donated over \$750,000 to the baseball community. This year, we will donate over \$24,000 in college scholarships to deserving young ballplayers and grants to youth baseball programs. OBAP members also staffed several coaching clinics during the past year. We accomplished these goals through efforts by board members to raise funds through the banquet and Diamond Classic golf tournament; by reaching out to the baseball programs around the Portland area by offering clinics for the coaches; and by increasing the membership in the OBAP to over 500 baseball enthusiasts. We thank all of those association members and sponsors for their efforts and donations that have helped make our annual banquet and golf tournament successes. We'll again see the rewards of these efforts in 2019.

Enjoy the evening talking baseball. As Johnny Pesky told us a few years ago: he had been to hundreds of baseball banquets but this one in Portland is the best he ever attended!

We are honored to have a number of outstanding figures in Oregon and national baseball circles with us this evening.

Darwin Barney earned an Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland scholarship in 2005, when the shortstop graduated from Southridge High in Beaverton and headed to Oregon State University. At OSU, Barney was a key to the Beavers winning national titles in 2006 and 2007 and also reaching the College World Series in 2005. Barney was taken by the Chicago Cubs in the fourth round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft, and by 2012 he earned the National League Gold Glove at second base. His 8-year MLB career also included playing for the Los Angeles Dodgers and Toronto Blue Jays.

Mike Barrett is managing director of the Portland Diamond Project, the effort to bring Major League Baseball to Portland. Barrett, a graduate of West Albany High and Oregon State University, spent 17 years as a broadcaster for the Port-

land Trail Blazers before taking his current post.

Tom Trebelhorn, former manager of the Milwaukee Brewers and Chicago Cubs, is a product of Cleveland High and Portland State University. After his playing career, his managing stops included the Portland Beavers and Salem-Keizer Volcanoes. He is now a minor league instructor for the San Francisco Giants.

Isaac Ropp, our master of ceremonies, co-hosts the highly popular "Primetime" on KFXX-AM 1080 weekdays from 3 p.m.-7 p.m.

The Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland congratulates these young men on their accomplishments and wishes them success in 2019 and beyond.



OLD-TIMERS' 2018 IN REVIEW

Thanks to your support of our banquet, golf tournament, and other donations, the Old-Timers Baseball Association of Portland is giving over \$24,000 to deserving individuals and organizations tonight. Here is a summary of OBAP projects completed and grants awarded during 2018:

1) Presented Stan Bozich Memorial Youth League Grants of \$1,500 each to Portland Cal Ripken Baseball, Portland Babe Ruth Baseball, Madison Baseball Community, Reynolds Little League, Parkside Little League and Tabor Villa Little League.

2) Several young players were awarded scholarships to enable them to attend baseball camps or play in leagues.

3) Three graduates of local high schools received \$5,000 college scholarships to assist in continuing both their educations and their baseball careers. Two of those given in honor of Ed Demorest and the third was given in memory of legendary Old-Timers Andy Pienovi and Stan Bozich.

4) OBAP members offered their expertise at clinics for a number of local youth leagues. (If you would like OBAP to provide a clinic for a youth league in your area, please contact OBAP President Tom Wise at teewise25@comcast.net)

5) OBAP members assisted in staging the Babe Ruth Age 13-15 Regional Tournament at David Douglas High.

BEAVERS TAKE NATIONAL TITLE

Oregon State rallies time after time to win College World Series crown

The third time was charmed. There's no other way to explain the way Oregon State negotiated a treacherous path to its third baseball national championship in June. At one point, the Beavers weren't only one strike away from elimination – the baseball was in the air that, if caught by any of three nearby Arkansas fielders, would end OSU's season and earn the Razorbacks the title.

But the ball dropped to the ground in foul territory, the Beavers used their new life to score three runs for a 5-3 win, then clinched the championship the next night with a 5-0 victory on June 29 at Omaha's TD Ameritrade Park.

That comeback was just one of three at the College World Series for the Beavers, who needed each one to remain in the tournament. They lost their first game and had to win four straight to make the championship series, then lost the first game of that best-of-three playoff to add two more do-or-die games.

"When you stay with things, you've got a chance," OSU head coach Pat Casey said after that improbable last-inning win over Arkansas. "We never felt like there was any fluke about it. If you were going to beat us, you were going to have rip these jerseys off our backs."

That didn't happen, unless an exuberant Beaver's celebratory grab of a teammate led to a wardrobe malfunction somewhere in the dogpile following the final out.

"I'll take this with me for the rest of my life, the memories we've made with these guys," second baseman Nick Madrigal said. "I am truly thankful to say I've played on this team with these guys."

Added shortstop Caden Grenier, who drove in the game-tying run in the second game against Arkansas after his foul fly fell untouched: "I came here for the family experience. I've got 30 brothers over here ... some of the best mentors I'll ever have in my coaches and a lot of family that I don't even know that I have in Beaver Nation."

Madrigal, the fourth overall pick in the Major League Baseball draft, and Grenier, also a firstround selection, were speaking to a welcome-home rally that packed Goss Stadium at Coleman Field the day after the final game; earlier that day the Beavers been feted at a similar gathering at Portland's Pioneer Courthouse Square.

The two weeks leading to those championship moments and a final 55-12-1 record were fraught with difficulties:

• In their second game, against Pacific Northwest rival Washington, the Beavers were down 3-0 in the fifth inning before a lengthy rain delay; when play resumed they stormed back for a 14-5 win.

• Next up was a rematch with North Carolina, which had beaten Oregon State in their CWS opener. Oregon State trailed 6-3 going into the eight inning, but as a light rain began to fall – "Beaver weather,"
